TOURNAMENT RULES

The tournament will be played to the F.I.P.J.P. Rules as adopted by Pétanque New Zealand with amendments to suit local conditions.

All entrants are required to participate in the entire tournament; i.e. a player cannot leave partway through or not return on Day 2 without good cause.

Late withdrawals for a good cause, such as illness, will be accommodated. The organising committee (through the APA secretary) is to be notified immediately of any such instances.

Note: Any player withdrawing from the tournament after the start of the event without good cause will be barred from participating in future Auckland Tournaments and local federations/associations will be notified.

Immediately at the conclusion of a game it is the responsibility of a player from each team to sign that the score is correct on the result sheet. Once signed, no dispute will be entered into.

Both positive and negative points will be used to calculate the points differential.

TEAMS

- APA requires all entrants to be of tidy appearance. Teams should be co-ordinated i.e. wear same-coloured shirts if possible.
- Open-toed shoes or jandals are not acceptable.
- All teams must have their own appropriate equipment for measuring points, as required by Article 25 of the Rules.
- Teams arriving late for games will have penalty points deducted as per Article 31 of the International Rules of Pétanque for timed games. Penalty of 1 point per 5 mins for late arrivals after the advertised start time.
- Immediately at the conclusion of a game it is the responsibility of a player from each team to sign that the score is correct on the result sheet. Once signed, no discussion will be entered into.

PLAYER CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

NO PRIVATE ALCOHOL IS ALLOWED ON SATURDAY OR SUNDAY.

THERE IS AN AUCKLAND COUNCIL ALCOHOL BAN ON SALISBURY RESERVE ADJOINING THE VENUE.

- No alcohol or smoking is allowed on the terrain whilst games are in progress.
- No player may absent him/herself from a game or leave the terrains of play without the authorisation of the Umpire. During time-limited games a player wishing to leave the terrain of play must have already played his/her boules to the end in progress.

Players must abide by the PNZ Code of Conduct. This is available at: www.petanquenz.com. Any player guilty of bad behaviour incurs penalties as outlined in the official rules, Articles 37 & 38.

RISK MANAGEMENT POLICY

Players should be aware that the game of pétanque involves a number of hazards that have the potential to cause harm to players, officials and/or spectators. These include:

- Being hit by a thrown or displaced boule.
- Being struck by objects such as pebbles or stones displaced by a thrown boule.
- Tripping over strings or other material used to delineate playing boundaries.

While the tournament organisers will take all reasonable steps to ensure that these risks are minimised, players entering a tournament also have the responsibility to ensure their own safety and the safety of others.

CANCELLATION OF TOURNAMENT

- The tournament will not be cancelled.
- Auckland Pétanque Association reserves the right to alter the tournament format or venue if any unforeseen events prevent the tournament from starting or finishing within the designated playing time.

DISPUTES

- The Umpire(s) appointed for the tournament will adjudicate in all matters to do with the tournament rules. Complaints should be made to the Umpire during the tournament.
- In all other matters the 2 members of the Organising sub-committee and 2 other APA Committee members will adjudicate.
